AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF A GENERAL AND SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF PORT ARTHUR ON SATURDAY, THE 7TH OF MAY, A.D., 2005; A GENERAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING COUNCILMEMBERS FROM DISTRICTS 1, 2, 3, AND 4; AND CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR DECIDING WHETHER OR NOT TO ADOPT PROPOSITIONS ONE THROUGH EIGHT AS TO ALLOW THE EXISTING SECTION 4A SALES TAX TO BE UTILIZED FOR VARIOUS CATEGORIES OF PROJECTS AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 4B OF ARTICLE 5190.6, VERNON'S TEXAS CODE ANNOTATED.

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 05-08 that called for a General Election for the purpose of electing Councilmembers from Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4; and

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2005, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 05-19 that called a Special Election on May 7, 2005, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City propositions as to whether or not the existing Section 4A Sales Tax shall be utilized for various categories of projects as described in Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Annotated (V.T.C.A.), calling for a Public Hearing, and providing for the publication of the election notice; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Charter of the City of Port Arthur, and the laws of the State of Texas applicable thereto, a General and a Special Election were held on Saturday, May 7, 2005, A.D., in the precincts into which the City of Port Arthur is divided for voting purposes; and

WHEREAS, said election was held for the purpose of allowing

the qualified voters to elect Councilmembers for Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4, as well as for the purpose of allowing the voters to decide whether or not the existing Section 4A Sales Tax shall be utilized for various categories of projects as described in Section 4B of Article 5190.6 V.T.C.A., as denoted herein:

PROPOSITION NO. ONE:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for professional and amateur (including children's) sports, and athletic purposes and events, including stadiums and ball parks, and related store, restaurant, concession, and automobile parking facilities, related area transportation facilities and related roads, streets, and water and sewer facilities, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. TWO:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for tourist and convention purposes and events including concert halls, museums, exhibition facilities, and related store, restaurant, concession, and automobile parking facilities, related area transportation facilities and related roads, streets, and water and sewer facilities, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. THREE:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for public park purposes and events including parks and park facilities, and related store, restaurant, concession, and automobile parking facilities, related area transportation facilities and related roads, streets, and water and sewer facilities, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. FOUR:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized to promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises that create or retain primary jobs, including a project to provide public safety facilities, streets and roads, drainage and related improvements, demolition of existing structures, general municipality owned improvements as well as any improvements or facilities that are related to any of those projects and any other project that the Section 4A board in its discretion determines promotes or develops new or expanded business enterprises that create or retain jobs, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. FIVE:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for the promotion of development and expansion of affordable housing as defined under by 42 U.S.C. Section 12745, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. SIX:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for the development or improvement of water supply facilities, including dams, transmission lines, well field developments, and other water supply alternatives, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. SEVEN:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for the development and institution of water conservation programs, including incentives to install water-saving plumbing fixtures, educational programs, brush control programs, and programs to replace malfunctioning or leaking water lines and other water facilities, which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

PROPOSITION NO. EIGHT:

Shall the existing Section 4A Sales and Use Tax within the City of Port Arthur be utilized for the cleanup of contaminated property which is a category of projects under Section 4B of Article 5190.6 Vernon's Texas Code Statutes?

WHEREAS, the sealed return of said election for the Councilmembers from Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4, and for Propositions Numbered One through Eight, have been duly made to the City Council of the City of Port Arthur, and the City Council has examined said returns.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ARTHUR:

<u>section 1.</u> That the facts and opinions in the preamble are true and correct.
