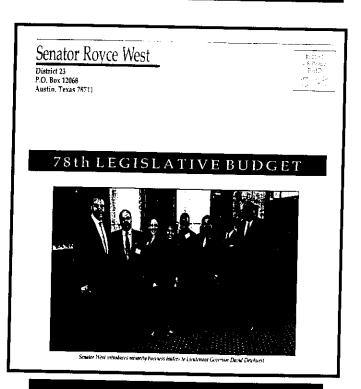

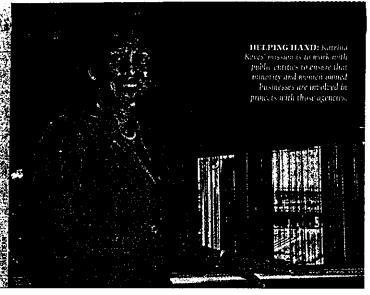

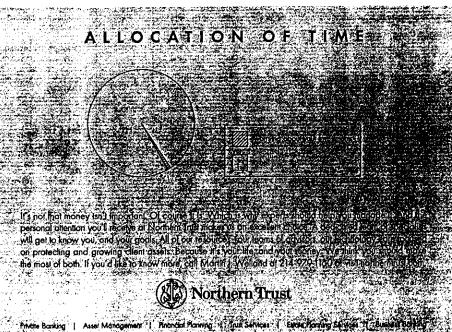
Such development, she continued, also helps minority and women entrepreneurs grow their wealth.
