Section 2. That the plan submitted by the City of Port Arthur Parks and Recreation Department is approved for use of PAEDC funds up to \$250,000.

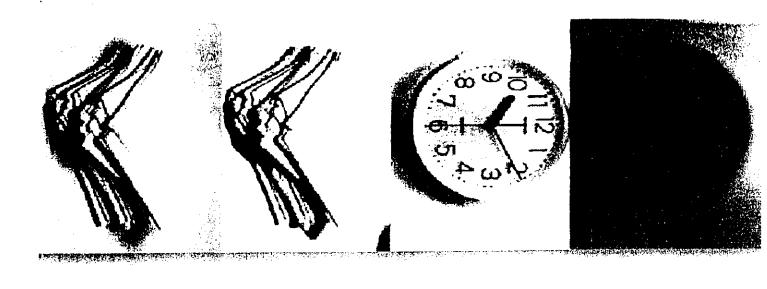
